Primary students showcased their handwriting while making Easter cards and writing stories on “Kindness is sunshine”.



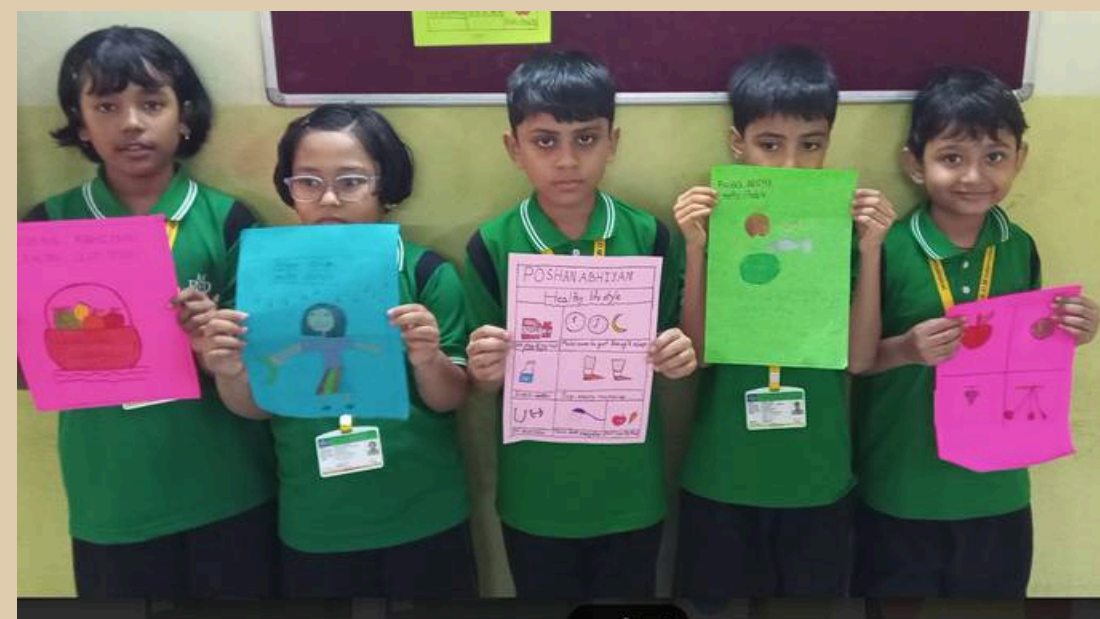
## Orientation Program For Grade V1

Students of Grade I to IX also conducted a special assembly on the theme “Sustainia” , emphasising hygiene and the need to incorporate healthy food into daily life.

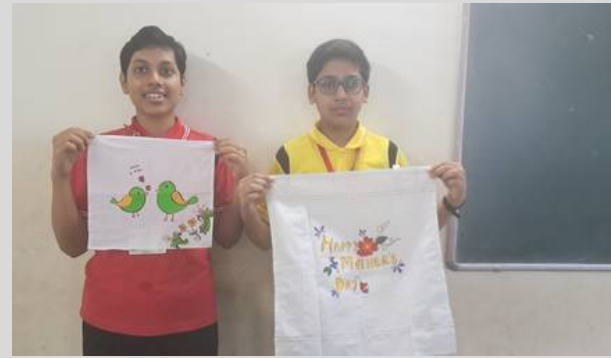




## Mother's Day Celebration

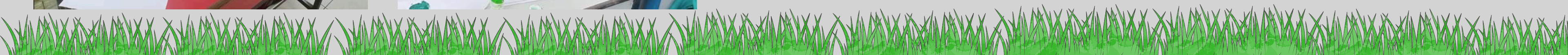


# World Environment Day Special Assembly

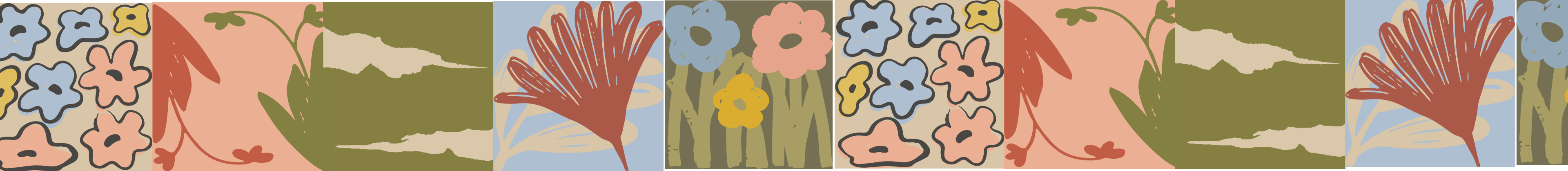


# Sparkle Spectacle

3. Community Economic Development: 3rd Prize





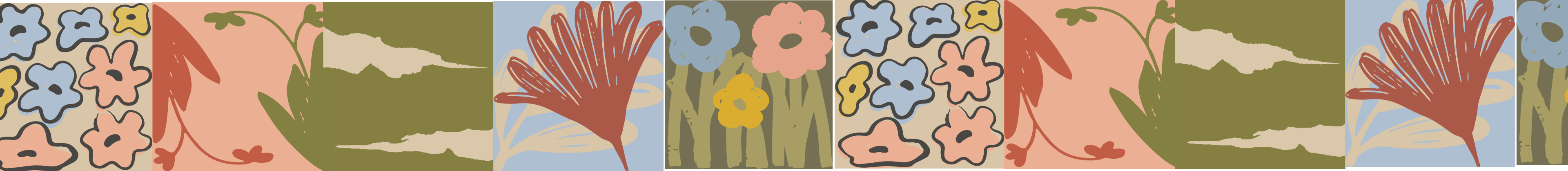
# “Green Initiative”

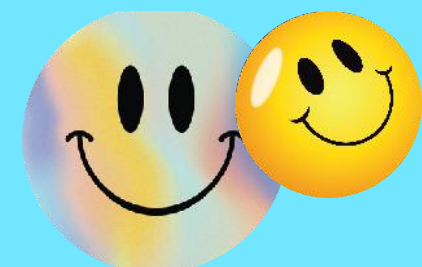
## Interactive Session on Mobile Phone Addiction

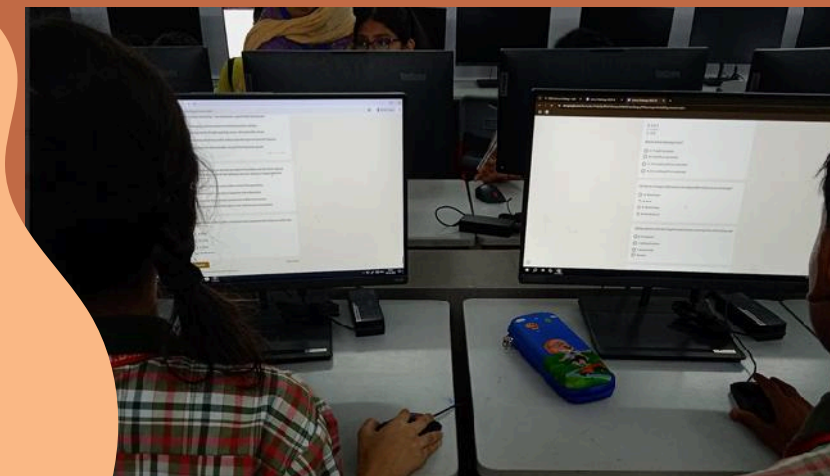
## Inter House Recitation Competition

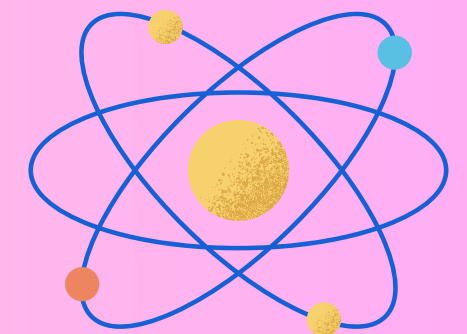
## Inter House Maths Quiz Competition

## Gita Chanting Competition

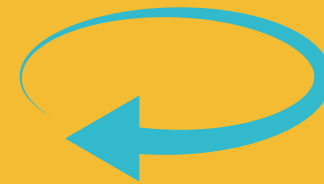

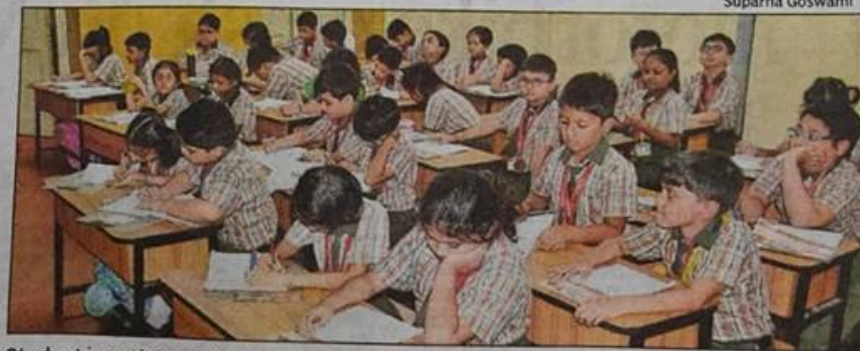
# City hosts final of multi-school spelling competition
