# Events and Activities


## Shiksha Saptah activities : Reading Activity


## Photoshoot




## Co-ordinators' meet


# Friends FM Ambassador Programme


# Focused Group Discussion On English Language Teaching

# Building a Borderless Future : Book by Book



## Workshop On Cyber Safety





# Chrysalis: Fest organised by DPS Ruby Park



# The Inter-House JAM Session


## Logiqids

The award ceremony was held on 12th September 2025 at the Kenilworth Hotel, Kolkata, where the school was felicitated among leading institutions across the country.



Can that glory and fame still be heard?




Chiku hung his head. "Sorry, Golu. I just wanted to make music," he squeaked. They sat at the temple pond, contemplating how to share both dreams.



## The Power of Small Moments





**A day rerouted, not cancelled**  
Schools respond with adaptability and caution. Several institutions make behind-the-scenes decisions to ensure that the day remains as academically productive and logistically smooth as possible. Some schools, anticipating possible travel delays and congestion, move their classes online — drawing upon their digital readiness developed over years of hybrid and remote learning. Others choose to stay open but do away with assessments compulsory attendance. One thread is common — a focus on protecting the rhythm of learning while allowing room for the unexpected...

**Although our school remained open, we did offer a few relaxations for both students and teachers. No late marks were recorded by staff members and attendance was not made compulsory. Since the day was not academically significant — there were no tests, assignments or assessments scheduled — we used it to revise previous lessons. We secured no new chapters were introduced, as we understand entrance are approaching, and we didn't want students to miss anything important. All schools in the vicinity were functioning and we followed suit. It was a regular working day, but with considerable adjustments in view of the rally.**  
**Abhinav Datta**, principal, National English School, VSP Road

**Our institution operates in two shifts and the early morning schedule helps us avoid most of the disruption anticipated due to the rally. The first shift concludes by 11am, by which time the city's traffic typically starts building up. Similarly, the second shift ends by 5.30pm, around the time the rally activity usually starts winding down. We have done this every year on July 21 and experience has taught us to prepare accordingly. We also made arrangements for school buses to pick up teachers or students if needed along the route. We do not schedule any assessments, but it is a standard working day.**  
**Purnima Chatterjee**, principal, M.P. Birla Foundation Higher Secondary School

**We transitioned to online classes for the day, primarily to avoid any difficulties our students might face during dispersal, especially since we have multiple dispersal timings. Many of our students are very young and ensuring their safety was our top priority. The classes continued as per schedule and students were informed in advance. Assignments and academic tasks were shared for home completion, just as they would be during a regular school day. No changes were made to the curriculum or timetable — we simply moved the classroom into the digital space to maintain consistency without compromising on safety.**  
**Gargi Banerjee**, principal, Sri Sri Academy

**We made the shift to online classes primarily to avoid traffic-related issues for our students, many of whom come from quite far. Google Classroom was used to conduct all lessons. Given that this rally happens every year, it has become a familiar process for us. Our decisions were rooted in safeguarding the security and comfort of the children. There was no intervention to the academic flow. Lessons were conducted without a hitch and students participated from the safety of their homes. The system worked smoothly, and the experience was handled with preparedness and calm.**  
**Suman Bhowmik**, principal, St Thomas' Boys' School, Koderma

**Our school was open on the day. While we did not declare an official closure, we were mindful of the fact that many of our teaching staff travel from within Calcutta, where traffic congestion was expected due to the rally. We ensured that all necessary information was disseminated to students. However, since no major events or assessments were scheduled for the day, there was no pressing academic loss. It was a busy but low-stakes day in our calendar and we asked everyone to proceed with caution. Attendance was not enforced strictly, and no student was penalised for missing classes due to transport concerns.**

**Our school remained open and functional as usual, with both students and teachers attending in person. However, we did anticipate potential traffic congestion, hence we decided not to schedule any examination on the day. Classes were conducted as per the normal routine.**

**We decided to close the school for the day, primarily as a precautionary measure. Our classes were in the middle of their final examinations and we felt that partial attendance could have created unnecessary confusion and hindered the students. The Examinations, which is located very close to our school, tends to become quite crowded on such days and every of our students travel by buses, metros and other public transport through that area. Given the likelihood of traffic congestion and movement restrictions, it simply made sense to avoid putting our students under pressure. We had also scheduled a compensatory working day on Saturday which will ensure that the academic calendar stays on track.**

**We decided that online classes would be the most seamless way to ensure continuity of learning, given the circumstances. Teachers worked from home and we followed the Monday format for convenience and clarity. It would have been difficult to call so many students to the school premises. Moreover, since students are already familiar with online learning methods due to the Covid experience, the shift was seamless. The only change in the routine — everything else continued as per plan. The learning environment remained intact, just transposed to a virtual space for the day.**

**We utilised the day as a non-working day for the teachers, so we adjusted our academic calendar variance. We converted a non-working day (July 19) into a working day, following Monday's timetable. It was already a working day for the teachers, so it simply accommodated the students as well. Our bus and transport system continues to function smoothly. We walked until Monday, so if preventive measure was smooth functioning. The school remained closed on the day of the rally, and staff and office members were present as usual. It was active and organised to avoid any last-minute complications.**

BDMI welcomed to 13 different schools that participated in the event, from all over the city.


The inter-school yoga competition served as a prominent platform for students to showcase their yogic prowess, promoting physical fitness, mental tranquility, and strengthening unity among schools.
